PRIMARY ENGINEERING CHALLENGE

Last term, we celebrated British Science Week by entering a competition run by STEM 'If you were an engineer what would you do?' We kicked this off with a visit from a real engineer, Adam Thicket, from Siemens Energy who came to speak to us about what things he has created, what inspires him and why he became an engineer. We even had the opportunity to interview him, asking our own questions about his job.
