

LITTLE DEANIES

This week Little Deanies have really enjoyed reading "The Gingerbread Man". Whilst reading the story the children have thought about the different emotions of the characters. They were also asked to think about how the gingerbread man would get across the river if the fox was not there. Some of the ideas they came up with were, getting on a boat, driving a submarine, stepping stones and riding a horse. The children drew a river in the nursery garden using chalk and then used their imagination to create the different ways over the river. The most successful appeared to be the stepping stones which they all had a go at using to cross the river.

Last week was Children's mental health week with the focus been "let's connect". As a class we discussed what "connect" means. The children were unsure at first therefore, we demonstrated the meaning using duplo. Once we had connected the pieces together, we read the story "Room on the Broom". We discussed what brought the animals and the witch together to be friends and talked about how they created a connection. We also spoke about the feelings the connection would make the character experience. The children said that they thought the characters would be happy as they are all friends. Once we had finished all of our discussions, we drew pictures of ourselves and someone we have a connection with. We drew what we do together, with that person, which is special and allows us to connect with them. Once we finished our pictures, we then cut them up and reconnected them like a jigsaw puzzle to reinforce the meaning of connect.
